

This funding is additional to the funding that is already available for Sub-Saharan Africa under the European Development Fund (EDF). However, HEIs will not be able to combine the funding within the same project. You will have to opt for either EDF or Junker Horn of Africa Window budget when funding a project with Tanzania for instance.
Region 14	Faroe Islands and Switzerland	€TBC	This budget envelope is for outgoing student mobility for traineeships in 'digital skills', from Programme Countries to the Faroe Islands or Switzerland.


In addition to the rules listed in the table above, the attainment of geographical balance is a general rule for all multi-country envelopes.
