

VET Mobility Charter 2018 Call UK Applicant Factsheet

What is the VET Mobility Charter?

The VET Mobility Charter (VMC) is a way of accrediting organisations that have a proven track record of delivering high quality mobility placements for staff and/ or learners in VET. The VMC is intended to encourage organisations to further develop their European internationalisation strategies in order to improve the quality of VET placements and to embed high quality mobility activities into their curricula. Accredited organisations will be expected to develop their international approaches, for example by networking with bodies in other countries, promoting the learning of foreign languages and looking beyond national VET approaches.

Who can apply?

Any public or private organisation active in the field of VET, established in one of the Erasmus+ Programme countries. You can apply individually or on behalf of a national mobility consortium.

The following selection criteria apply:

- Individual applicants: applicants must have completed at least three VET mobility projects with an average budget consumption rate of at least 80% for the last three completed projects.
- Applications submitted on behalf of a consortium: either the consortium as a whole or each individual organisation must have completed at least three VET mobility projects. In addition, either the consortium as a whole or each individual organisation must have had an average budget consumption of 80% from the last three completed projects.

Why should I apply?

VMC holders benefit from more streamlined application and reporting procedures. The VMC is awarded for the entire duration of the Erasmus+ programme, until 2020.

How do I apply?

The European Commission eForm will be released in March 2018 to download, complete and submit by the deadline of 11am (UK time) on 17 May 2018. Please refer to the 2018 VET Mobility Charter Call EAC/A06/2017, which is accessible on the [Erasmus+ website](#).
